A warm welcome back to Term 2. I have been so impressed with how smooth the transition has been from Alert Level 4 to the Alert Level 3 Bubble Classrooms to the Alert Level 2 'new normal'. This week we have over 90% of our learners back with us. It has been a joy to have our learners back onsite. They have been amazing, and are so quick to adapt and get on with it. There have been lots of happy reunions with friends and teachers.

A huge thank you to all of our parents for your support of distance learning during the lockdown. Thank you for supporting us through Alert Level 2, especially with drop off and pick up. I know it must feel strange for some of you stopping at the gates instead of coming onto the grounds. We appreciate your patience. After yesterday's announcement, it looks like we will continue to have controlled entry to the grounds for the next month so that we can meet contact tracing requirements that have been set.

A huge welcome to all of our new learners who have started at school in the last week. They have settled in beautifully, and I know our teachers are enjoying getting to know them and their families.

As a staff, we have focused on settling in and connecting again and we are now looking at resetting our priorities. While it may feel like time has been lost, we have all gained a lot. I think that however unexpected and inconvenient lockdown was for a number of reasons, there are many positives to be taken forward. The opportunity to work alongside our own children and realise their strengths and struggles has made our home/school partnerships stronger.

Reporting using HERO

With the disruption of lockdown and extended time away from school, we have had to recalibrate our initial timeline to roll out Hero for whānau.

Initially, we had intended to make learning and assessment content 'live' this term but that is now more likely to be early Term 3.

What I can say, is that over the second half of the term our teachers will be working with students to update learning goals in reading, writing and maths so that when we do go 'live' there is a good picture of learning progress for each student.

We were also intending to run a parent information evening at the end of Term 1 to provide parents with an opportunity to learn more about Hero and the benefits it has in terms of increasing visibility of teaching and learning. This information session will be rescheduled later this term with more details to be provided over the next few weeks.
