Parking around the school at 3 pm

Traffic and parking around schools are always problematic, especially at the end of the school day when 400 children are leaving the grounds at one time. Moving our learners off the grounds and home safely is the biggest priority at these times, so please help us by:

- Parking in places that are **legal and safe**. Over driveways and on blind corners are unacceptable at any time, as these lines ensure clear lines of sight for other road users
- Using the pedestrian crossings
- Slowing down and paying close attention children can move in ways that are unpredictable and we need to almost expect this

There have been some significant 'near-miss' situations around the front of our school in recent days, that sound absolutely terrifying.

While there are some challenges with the flow of traffic at the front of the school, we are quite lucky to have alternative routes that students can use to leave the grounds safely. Harper Street, Chelsea View (and surrounding areas) are good options for meeting your child. Making sure your child has a raincoat packed in their bag is also a good idea, as wet days seem to be the most dangerous, with parents trying to get as close to the exit gates as possible.


Matariki Breakfast - You're invited!
