We are currently planning how best to launch these values with our learners at the beginning of 2021. There will be explicit teaching and modelling of what each value looks like in action. In this newsletter, we will take a closer look at Kaitiakitanga and Manaakitanga

**Kaitiakitanga** is about guardianship. We all must recognise the importance of caring for our environment and each other. The responsibility for being proactive citizens is also about understanding that care is taken so that future generations can benefit from our natural world.

**Manaakitanga** is about caring for and respecting each other's mana. Respectful relationships, empathy and care are key to this value.
